- ☐ Diagnosed with a developmental disability before the age of 22 and receive Medicaid.

And/Or

- ☐ Approved and funded for Home and Community Based Medicaid Waiver Services.

Based in Hopewell Junction, New York, Greystone Programs is a nonprofit human services agency that provides essential services and life-enriching opportunities in five Hudson Valley, New York counties for children, adults and families living with autism and other developmental disabilities.

Founded in 1979 by Marc W. Kelley, Greystone Programs offered the first privately-run group home in New York State for people with Autism. Our ground-breaking initiative was the first to take people out of traditional institutions and instead offer them opportunities to live as family in small, comfortable group homes with caring, inspiring staff. For those seven men with Autism, it was home, and more importantly, a new lease on life. It was the first time people with Autism were able to live as neighbors in a community.

Today we offer 14 group homes and one apartment in three counties, as well as community based initiatives that include After School and School Break Programs, Social Skills Programs, Day Habilitation Services, Community Habilitation, Medicaid Service Coordination, In-Home Behavior Therapy, Family Education and Training, Family Enrichment Nights, Respite and Bridges to Health Programs for children with Autism who are also in foster care.

What is Medicaid Service Coordination?

Medicaid Service Coordination (MSC) is a Medicaid State Plan Service provided by the New York State Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD), which assists persons with developmental and intellectual disabilities by gaining access to necessary services and supports appropriate to the needs of the individual.

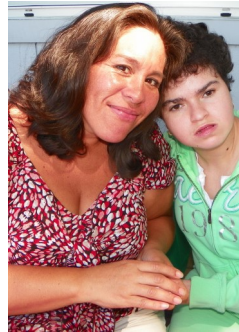
Medicaid Service Coordination is provided by Greystone Programs, Inc. and uses a person-centered planning process in developing, implementing and maintaining an Individualized Service Plan (ISP) for our individuals. Medicaid Service Coordination promotes the concepts of choice, individualized services and supports, and individual satisfaction.

Greystone Programs, Inc. is a MSC vendor through OPWDD. All individuals and their families have the opportunity to

Interview their Medicaid Service Coordinator and choose the MSC most appropriate to meet their needs.

Greystone Programs, Inc. provides MSC services in community and supportive settings.

Aspects of Medicaid Service Coordination

- ❑ Our Medicaid Service Coordinators act as the person's advocate, promoting his or her cause, and defending his or her rights when the person is unable to do it alone.

"I cannot imagine not having our Service Coordinator in our lives to help us navigate through the system." (Parent)

- ❑ Our Medicaid Service Coordinators work in partnership with the person and their family. Greystone believes "nothing about me without me".
- ❑ Our Medicaid Service Coordinators help each person achieve a balanced and integrated perspective of his or her life.

"If the Service Coordinator does not have the answer, she will work tirelessly to find one". (Parent)

- ❑ Our Medicaid Service Coordinators promote and monitor the person's health, safety and medical needs.

"She has made a tremendous difference in our lives". (Parent)

- ❑ Our Medicaid Service Coordinators always foster inclusion (community membership) and self-determination. These are basic values of our service system.
- ❑ Our Medicaid Service Coordination Department is a distinct service from other services



Responsibilities of the Medicaid Service Coordinator to the Individual Person

- ❑ Advocacy, which includes expertise in educational advocacy
- ❑ Arrange and assist with necessary meetings for the individual
- ❑ Develop, implement and maintain ISP
- ❑ Build relationships
- ❑ Network to find resources for the Individual
- ❑ Collaborate with all service providers
- ❑ Work towards individuals desired outcomes and life goals
